
In closing I ask you to continue lifting up our churches, councils, and worship leaders in your prayers.

### Worship Notes:

Communion, where to start. The question is always how often should we be participating in Communion. Largely the fear is that if we receive communion too often that is becomes too common and thus not as special anymore. I am going to urge you to please continue reading this article and bear with me a little and in the end if you don't look at communion a little differently that is fine, but just at least hear me out.

Does Jesus serving us his body and blood each week make it

ordinary? People typically didn't and don't view His healings and His other miracles as too common. In fact, they seemed to, in Jesus' day, want more of that from Him. So why do WE then want less of what is given to us through the sacrament of Holy Communion?

Psalm 105:4-5

"Seek the LORD and his strength;

Seek his presence continually.

Remember the wonderful works he has done,

His miracles and the judgements he has uttered."

Through Holy communion Jesus exchanges His perfection for our sin, His righteousness for our unrighteousness. He gave His body and His blood to set us free from sin. One would think for this sacrifice we would want to draw closer to him thru communion; thru the elements, His Body, His Blood shed for YOU, for ME, for ALL GOD'S PEOPLE by partaking in it more often not less often.

The argument that communion every week makes it somehow less "special" is somewhat invalid if you put it in a slightly different perspective. How many times a week do you tell your spouse/significant other or even your kids for that matter that you love them? Now think about how special those words "I love you" are. If you treat this like you treat communion you should only be telling your loved ones that you love them once or twice a month, otherwise those words lose their meaning, their shininess, their specialness. Now tell me how something so important as Jesus laying down His life for your sins becomes any less important the more, we take part in communion. How does God's grace and forgiveness mean less just because we are doing it each and every week?

In closing, it's the body and the blood of Christ it strengthens us and gives us God's grace, how could it ever lose its specialness no matter how often we take it. We are always in need of Him and should always be seeking Him in everything we do. Sunday morning should be no different.

If you made it the end of this article, I thank you, truly, and hope that it gave you something to think about the next time you take communion. May God bless you and shine favor upon you always.





Music Notes – April 2025

April is going to be a very busy month! That's what happens when the tail end of Lent, Palm Sunday, Holy Week, The Three Days (the Triduum), the Resurrection, and the glorious celebrations that continue after Easter all occur within the same calendar month!

The choir at Messiah has been working very hard preparing some very beautiful music for our services. We will be singing some older anthems (obtained from the former St. Luke Lutheran in Sunbury), a newer anthem that was freshly ordered, and others that have been re-worked especially for our choir. ALL of them are wonderful and we hope that you both enjoy them and find them meaningful. (Does anyone hear bongo drums?)

As always, singers from both churches are invited to join the choir for Palm Sunday, when we'll be singing "Draw Nigh to Jerusalem" by David Williams, and on Easter, when we'll be presenting "Hallelujah! Jesus is Risen" by David L. Ray at the Sunrise Service at Brick and the 10:15 service at Messiah. Just see Jeff for more information! We'd love to have you join us!

Church Music is chosen very carefully. It's both a prayerful and joyful task to plan music for our services. For anthems, the lyrics of the piece are extremely important, for we try to align the text of the anthem with at least some of the text from the lectionary appointed for the day. Other things that must be considered are the singability, tone, and the texture of the selection. For the prelude and postlude, it's again helpful if the pieces emphasize the theme for the day. In "ordinary time," this is less important for preludes and postludes, but for the seasons of the church year, for festivals and for feast days, it's something that's incredibly important.

Holy Week is an amazing time! We start with a break in the somber purple as it changes to brilliant red, which is premonition of the bloody sacrifice yet to come. As "Passion Sunday" unfolds, it shows the agonies of betrayal that will occur on Maundy Thursday. Regal purple returns as we are reminded to "Love one another, even as I have loved you," when the King Himself becomes our servant and washes our feet in the lowliest of tasks. On Good Friday, the church is bare of all ornamentation, and black is the color of the day, the color of mourning. We depart in silence as we wonder .... ponder .... and pray ....

On Easter Morning, we start off silently until the Resurrection is proclaimed: "Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!" The paraments are white and gold, the church is full of light, there are flowers everywhere, the Tomb is empty, "Alleluia" returns in abundance, and the music is bold and joyful. The promise has been fulfilled! Jesus has Risen! Death is swallowed up in victory!

Christ has died! Christ is Risen! Christ will come again!

### **Brunch Special**

(I chose this recipe this month due to us hosting Easter Sunrise Service. For those families that participate in this service I thought this was an appropriate recipe as a Brunch Special might be just what is needed after an early, early service. I hope that some of you will give this one a try. I know my family will be using for Easter Sunday as a breakfast before our Easter Worship.)

4 slices bread, buttered and cubed	½ tsp. dry mustard
5 eggs, slightly beaten	1 /₂ c. grated cheddar cheese
2 c. Milk	
Fillings:	
Cooked ham	Mushrooms
Sausage, cooked	Bacon, cooked

Mix all ingredients, except filling. Store in the refrigerator overnight (covered). In the morning, add filling and stir well. Pour into greased 1 1/2 quart casserole. Bake at 375° for 75 minutes, or until knife comes out clean. (Check before 75 minutes)
