Greetings to each of you from the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit

My, I can't believe how time flies. Here we are in March and the Season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is March 5th. There will be a service of Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion at Brick Church at 3 PM, and at Messiah at 7 PM that day

As I close, I want to touch base on something that bugs me a little sometimes and a lot at other times. It involves folks who are having a rough time in their lives. Call them, go to see them, take them for coffee or take them to lunch. Believe me, I hear about it when someone cares enough to call or visit people. As of this writing there are 6 people from Brick Church and 2 people from Messiah who are in assisted living or nursing homes. If this number is incorrect, please let me know of others who are in Nursing or assisted living facilities. Please continue to pray for all the care givers and family members who are involved in their care.

Please contact me with Pastoral needs you are aware of; it frustrates me when I find out after the fact that someone was hospitalized or sick at home.

May God continue to Bless each of you and every person that you touch in your daily life.



### **Worship Notes:**

This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed. Composed in the year 325 in the city of Nicea (in modern Turkey) and later revised in the second ecumenical council held in Constantinople, this creed is held among Christians as an expression of our faith into which we baptize and from which we teach. The creed expresses our common belief in God who has become known to us in the three persons of the Trinity.

The primary focus of this creed is in the second and longest article: "We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ...". When we recite these, we remind one another that the God who has created all things became incarnate, taking on human flesh and bearing our sins on the cross. This incarnation means that our God became truly human, experiencing life as we experience it, with all our joys and sorrows, even the agony of torture and death, for us. In the person of Jesus Christ, then, human flesh was raised into the Trinity, thus breaking the barrier that sin had erected between God and creation. The Holy Spirit, which once spoke through the prophets, now, by the forgiveness of sins, proceeds to create the "one holy catholic and apostolic church," that is "the communion of saints". In this church, we proclaim the promise of resurrection to life everlasting as our flesh also is welcomed into the Trinity.





- Based on this volume of clothing, your organization received \$844



The Ash Wednesday Service, March 5, will be held at St John Brick at 4 PM. The special envelope donations for Ash Wednesday, Easter and Christmas Eve will be divided 50/50 to Son-Light House and Footprints.

The 5 churches currently in the Co-Op will be rotating services for the mid-week Lenten services again this year. Services will begin at 6:30 with refreshments after the services. St. John Brick will host the March 26<sup>th</sup> service. There will be no communion and no monetary collection at this service.

Due to in-climate weather, church was cancelled on February 9. The notice was placed on our Facebook page the night before and the council call chain was activated for the notification. If you did not receive a call/text message, please contact Melissa in the church office to be added to the list.

The fellowship hall floor was stripped, waxed, and polished in early February. If you have time, walk up to the hall to check it out.

The church's Facebook page currently has 299 followers. In the last 28 days our FB page had 2,056 views (number of times our content was played or displayed) and 67 interactions (the number of likes, reactions, saves, comments, shares and replies on our content). On Sunday, February 23 we had 133 views of the bulletin and 104 views of the service and on Sunday, February 16 we had had 233 views of the bulletin and 173 views of the service. #### **Music Notes March 2025**

At long last, the Holy Season of Lent is upon us! The word "Lent" comes from the English word "Lenten," which refers to the lengthening of days that is characteristic of late winter and early spring. Traditionally, there are forty days in Lent, not counting Sundays. Going from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday, there are forty days inclusive, which we're reminded of in several of our hymns, such as "Forty Days and Forty Nights," "The Glory of these Forty Days," and "O Lord, throughout these Forty Days."

There's obviously something special about the number 40. It can symbolize a period of trial, tribulation, transformation, and new life. For example, rain fell for 40 days and 40 nights during the Great Flood. Moses spent 40 years in Egypt and 40 years in the desert. He also spent 40 days on Mount Sinai twice. The Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years. Many Biblical kings ruled for 40 years, including David, Solomon, and Saul. Jesus fasted in the wilderness for 40 days after His baptism. He also appeared to His apostles for 40 days after his resurrection. Goliath challenged the Israelites for 40 days before David defeated him. Jonah spent 40 days in Ninevah.

During these Forty Days, we remember Jesus' forty days in the wilderness, where He fasted, prayed, and strove to fight off the devil. Through self-denial, prayer, and reflection, we are able to catch a glimpse of what Christ did for us before He suffered and died on our behalf. It's more than appropriate that we restructure our worship services to reflect this as well.

We are well acquainted with the fact that there are three cycles of lessons in the church year, years A, B, and C. During Year A, which coincided with my first year with you, the preludes and postludes consisted of arrangements of well-known Lenten hymns. Year B featured the music of famous classical composers for the preludes and postludes. During this year, Year C, the preludes will be drawn from music that will be less familiar, yet appropriate for the season. The postludes will be soft reflections of the final hymn, fitting for the closure of a somber service. There will be no rejoicing, and no "Alleluias" until Easter.

The choir at Messiah is preparing some very nice anthems for Lent, Palm Sunday, and Easter. Palm Sunday's anthem will be the famous "Draw Nigh to Jerusalem" by Williams, and on Easter, we will be singing a new work by David H. Ray, "Hallelujah! Jesus is Risen!" We always welcome extra singers, and would like to cordially invite anyone from either Brick or Messiah to join us, especially for the anthems planned for Palm Sunday and Easter. # Pennsylvania Dutch Salad with Hot Bacon Dressing

3 slices bacon

1 egg, well beaten

1 ½ TBSP. flour

1 cup milk

¼ cup vinegar

1/4 cup sugar

½ tsp. salt

1 qt. salad greens

Chop bacon and fry until crisp. Remove bacon and add to the greens. Add all other ingredients to the beaten eggs and pour into hot bacon fat. Cook until thickened. Pour at once over the dry, crisp greens (lettuce, endive, dandelion, or spinach). A little chopped onion may be added to greens, if desired. Yield: 4-6 servings.
