From Jim's Desk

Blessings to each and everyone as we continue serving God and his people. As we continue through the church year and Luke's Gospel, I hope you have taken advantage of the weekly readings either in your bulletin (Brick) or the celebrate insert (Messiah) each week. These readings offer guidance for learning more about God's Love and Grace.

The month of November begins with All Saints Sunday on November 2nd, the day we remember all the saints who have gone before us to become members of the church Triumphant. November 9th feels like Easter because this week the lessons celebrate the reality of Easter. (We celebrate Easter every Sunday because that is the day of the week Jesus was raised from the dead.) On November 16th our lessons are focused on the End Times when there will be frightening signs and events. November 23rd we celebrate Christ the King, on this day Jesus reveals that to be Messiah and King is to give ones life for others. Also on that Sunday at 2PM there will be a Thanksgiving service at Messiah. Pastor Tammy Syler from the Clarkstown Methodist Church will be providing the message titled "Count Every Blessing". This will be a community service with members of Brick, Messiah, and the Methodist church as well as the general public invited.

November 30th begins the new church year with the first Sunday of Advent, the season of preparation for the coming of the Baby Jesus, the new born King, the Messiah. During Advent we will have Holy Communion weekly except on December 14th due to the congregational meeting that day. In preparation for receiving the Christ Child it is important to receive His Body and Blood as often as we can. Luther felt the need to receive Christ's Body and Blood every day so he could be assured that his sins were forgiven. The Lords supper is the ultimate meal you and I can partake in. I believe Jesus intended us to receive his Holy Supper EVERY TIME WE WORSHIP. I know it's extra work, but if we truly love the Lord and want to serve his people we should do all we can to make our worship experience all it can be.

As you continue serving God's people, I urge you to consider serving on church council or a committee within the church. Please contact any council member if you would like to serve or have questions about serving.



Education

Worship and education are the twin pillars of the church. Luther combined liturgical with catechetical reforms so that clergy and laity could be partners in ministry.

Lutheran Christian education trains for life in community, in the church. The church is the embodiment of the gospel in a world plagued by evil, sin, and death. Evil is the mysterious force that divides and confuses (related to "diabolical" from the Greek diabollein, meaning "to tear apart"). Sin is the temptation to be like God (Gen. 3:5). Death is the shadow that darkens all of life.

The Lutheran catechisms have five parts: the Ten Commandments, the Apostle's Creed, the Lord's Prayer, Baptism, and the Lord's Supper. These five parts

Baptism:

(taken from Lutheran Book of Worship pg. 121)
In Holy Baptism our gracious heavenly Father liberates us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; in the waters of Baptism we are reborn children of God and inheritors of eternal life. By water and the Holy Spirit we are made members of the Church which is the body of Christ. As we live with him and with his people, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

The Lord's Supper

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me. Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.



Music Notes November 2025

The month of November is a very interesting one in the church year. We start with All Saint's Sunday, when we remember all those who have gone before us . . . then have a few more "green" Sundays, manage to work in Thanksgiving, then celebrate the conclusion of the church year with The Feast of Christ the King. Sometimes we even start the new church year in November with the First Sunday in Advent. We have a wide variety of worship themes, moods, and colors.

On All Saints' Sunday this year, we will be singing a hymn that might be new to some of you. It's entitled "Rejoice in God's Saints!" in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* and is a very well-known and much-loved hymn in the Episcopal Church, where it is known as "O Praise Ye the Lord!" I have been introducing this vibrant and dramatic hymn, so we will all will have heard and gotten familiar with it by All Saints' Sunday.

On November 23, at 2pm, Messiah will be hosting the annual Thanksgiving Service. I am hoping to assemble a choir from Messiah, Brick, and Clarkstown United Methodist. We will be singing Ralph Vaughan Williams' arrangement of Psalm 100, which was written for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. Even though it won't sound quite the same, this is a beautiful work that won't require much preparation. If you would like to be a part of this singing group, please contact me as soon as possible. I'm hoping one rehearsal will do it!

The choir at Messiah has been working diligently on anthems for November and will soon be starting work on its preparations for Christmas!

We begin Lectionary Year A on the last Sunday of November, which is also the first Sunday of Advent. The Gospels for the new church year come from Matthew, which is considered by some to be the most important book in the New Testament. It is written for a primarily Jewish audience, emphasizes Jesus' teachings (particularly the Sermon on the Mount), his lineage from King David, and His mission to bring salvation to all people. It is structured around key themes, including the prophecies of the Messiah, the identity of Jesus, and the spread of God's kingdom.







October Outreach Ministries

Over the past month, the congregation completed two outreach ministries. One was a donation of blankets for Blanket Sunday and one was collecting can goods/cereal for Harvest Home Sunday.

On Blanket Sunday, October 5th, the blankets were blessed during the service before being delivered. From the blankets that were donated, 25 blankets were delivered to First Church, Williamsport for their homeless shelter Code Blue. The total hand-made items donated were 16 quilts and tied blankets, 3 prayer shawls, and 14 baby blankets, and 4 baby caps. The baby blankets and caps were donated to Ronald McDonald House, Danville and the quilts and tied blankets were donated to Muncy Place and Heritage Springs.
